

Thaïsa Olivia first fell in love with jazz in New Orleans. Since then, she has been performing on a variety of stages in Europe and the US, always accompanied by excellent musicians. On a regular basis with the Thaïsa Olivia Quartet, The Croonettes, in Germany (close harmony & jazz), The Jaap Dekker Band (jazz & blues), Big Band Balance (swing), The Grand Piano Boogie Train, with Rob Agerbeek, Jaap Dekker, Rob Hoeke (jazz & blues), The Feen Brothers (jazz); Hot Club de Frank (hot cub de France), Up With People, US & Europe one year tour (allround repertoire).

Her curriculum is extensive, ranging from singing, dancing, presenting, coaching, directing and more. Her extensive array of performances has gained her critical acclaim and a solid reputation. Her quartet CD 'Let Go' garnered raving reviews. Currently, she is working on a brand-new quartet album. Thaïsa visits New York frequently, where she made a promising vocal debut in several of its jazz venues in 2013. New York City has become her home away from home and she regularly performs in its vibrant jazz scene. She appeared a.o at the renowned Jazz at Kitano, as well as Zinc, the Cupping Room, Zeb's, Brownstone Jazz and The Cornelia Street Cafe. She toured the Canary Islands, Lanzarote, successfully with her quartet and was thrilled to perform in New Orleans at the legendary Spotted Cat Music Club and Snug Harbor.



LIGHTING: WASHES AND FOR EACH MUSICIAN ONE SPOTLIGHT



GRAND PIANO: Steinway D Concert or Yamaha C7 or bigger in mint condition, well tuned before the soundcheck <u>and</u> before the concert (A1 = 440-442 Hz)

Other grand pianos are only accepted when agreed by the artists!

BASS & AMPLIFIER (if not artist provided):

Double bass:

- The instrument has to be in mint condition
- Body: <u>all wood</u> front, sides and back (rumble free, <u>no ply-wood</u>)
- Scale (between bridge and top nut): 104 106,5 cm (3/4)
- "D-measure" scale (1st finger in the 4th position)
- Adjustable bridge, max. height of the strings at fingerboard end: E string: 9 mm | A string: 8 mm | D string: 7 mm | G string: 6 mm.
- Strings: Pirastro Evah Pirazzi or Thomastik (medium tension)
- Pick up: The Realist (David Gage)
- End pin length: min. 35 cm.
- French Bow + Pops Rosin

Bass Amplifier:

- First choice: Little Mark CMD 121 combo
- Second choice (festivals): Little Mark 800 tube + HR104 Cabinet
- Alternative choices: Gallien-Krueger or David Eden combos
- Please make sure there only 10 and 12 inch speakers, no 15 inch!
- 1x Music stand with light
